Korean Movement Day (3/1)

Korean Independence 1919, Movement Day, or the March 1st Movement is a national holiday in South Korea. The Korean Independence movement was ongoing campaign to liberate Korea from Japan since 1910.

The campaign reached a high point on March 1st, 1919. On this day, a series of public demonstrations happened when Japan was occupying still Korea. These were public demonstrations against Japanese Government. It was a nationalistic show of strength and resistance against Japanese military rule in Korea.

Because this happened on March 1, 1919, the holiday's official name became the March 1st Movement Day or Sam-il Movement Day (literally meaning Three – One or March 1st).

On March 1st every year, Korean people celebrate The March 1st Movement Day, known in Korea as 삼 일 절 (Samiljeol).

The name 삼 일 절 (samiljeol) can be broken into three parts:

삼 (sam) = 3 일(il) = day / 1 절 (jeol) = festival day (word suffix)
